FACTS ABOUT SUMMER READING

<u>It takes 4 -</u> Did you know? By reading 4 books or more over the summer, kids can avoid the "summer slide: or gap in academic skills, when they return to school in the fall.

<u>Let them choose</u> - Forget asking kids to read the latest Newberry tearjerker. Ask them to choose the books they want to read.

<u>Big Vocabularies</u> - Kids learn 4,000 - 12,000 new words every year by reading. That means 3 months without books can make a huge difference in their vocabularies and test scores.

Encourage your child to read. You won't be sorry you did!
