For your easy reference an excerpt from the Code Of Conduct:

The following is prohibited:

PANTS: oversized baggy jeans, or cargo pants, pants worn below the intended waistline or inside out, cut-up pants, rips or holes may be above mid-thigh.

SHORTS/SKIRTS: extremely brief garments such as short skirts or short shorts, cut-off shorts, dresses that have slits above mid-thigh, or shorter than 3 inches above the knees, low riding pants that expose body parts or tattoos

SHIRTS/TOPS:any see-through garments, undershirts, no midriff tops, tube tops, net tops, halter top, oversized tank tops, spaghetti tops, plunging necklines (front and back) SHOES:bare feet, flip-flops/slippers, cleated shoes, shoe skates, Chinese slippers, footwear that is a safety hazard
