Dear Parents/Guardians,

As we complete the first week of the third marking period, you are encouraged to monitor your child's attendance to school and their report card grades. As you may be aware, the students' final report card grade will be determined as follows:

<u>Full-year Courses</u>: The final report card grade will be an average of the first four marking period report card grades and the final exam or grade on the New York State Regents examination. This means that the final report card grade will be the average of five grades. Each marking period and the final exam or regents is weighted 20%, together totaling100%.

<u>Half-year Courses:</u> These courses are designed for two marking periods. Each marking period is weighted 40% and the final exam or regents is weighted 20%, together totaling 100%.

It is imperative that you stay informed regarding your child's effort, grades and attendance to school. Signing up for the *parent portal* is the best way to monitor your child's performance in school. This tool allows you to access your child's *attendance in school, completion of homework assignments and projects, tests and quizzes grades, lateness to class and school.* If you have not signed up for the parent portal, please see Mrs. Maria Gordineer in the PHS Guidance Office. While you are there, please be sure to speak to Mrs. Gordineer about scholarship opportunities for your child. Our children need encouragement from home and school in order to demonstrate their greatness.

As a parent, I know firsthand that being a parent can be challenging. My children range in age from 8 to 22 years old. Research indicates that teenagers experience more changes during this period of their lives than at any other point. As a school community, we are available to assist you! At the high school, we have strong community partnerships with Hudson Valley Health Care, Andrus and Westchester Jewish Community Services. The City School District of Peekskill has partnered with the Technical Assistance Center on Disproportionality of New York University. TAC-D is contracted through the New York State Department of Education (NYSED) Office of Special Education to develop, implement, and assess a process of providing comprehensive technical assistance and professional development trainings to New York State School Districts. The TAC-D trainers provide a platform for teachers and administrators to confront sensitive issues such as *race*, *ethnicity*, *and cultural differences* as they relate to students' experiences in school.

At the high school, since the start of the school year, the entire faculty has engaged in practices best described as *cultural competency*, which is supported by the work promoted by TAC-D. "Cultural competency is the ability to successfully teach students who come from cultures other than our own. It entails developing certain personal and interpersonal awareness and sensitivities, developing certain bodies of cultural knowledge, and mastering a set of skills." As educators living in a diverse world and working in an ethnically, economically, and culturally diverse community such as Peekskill, it is critically important that we develop an understanding of cultural competence and a willingness to amend our practices and those of colleagues, friends and family members, when needed. Mr. Carlo Vidrini, Robotics Teacher, continues to amaze me with his *passion, dedication and* service to our students!!! Carlo volunteers his time and resources to our students on the weekends (*Saturday and Sundays*) and his efforts are greatly appreciated by our students.

- The Peekskill High School Robotics Team 4243 Iron Red Devils brought home their first trophy after competing in an FTC robotic competition at Riverside High School in Yonkers.
- On Sunday, February 5 the Peekskill High School Robotics Team 4243 will compete in the FTC Robotics Championship Competition at PACE University. They will compete against the 30 best teams from Albany, New York, Connecticut and New Jersey.

When we win it this year, we will be one of seventeen teams from around the country to be invited to participate in the national competition in Ohio.

On **Saturday**, **February 4** Dr. Margie Daniels and Officer Andre Wright participated in a panel discussion regarding issues related to substance abuse and addiction.
