3. Clarification: Root Cause Survey

Due to being cited for the disproportionate suspension of African American males, the District is required to complete a staff survey. The survey is important to the understanding the Root Cause process and asks respondents about their curriculum,

school climate, self-efficacy, teacher-student relationships, instructional supports, and responsiveness to the needs of diverse students. It also includes specific sections for school leaders and teachers. The District is being supported by NYU Technical Assistance Center on Disproportionality and each of our schools has a team that is participating in the Root Cause analysis workshops held at Central Office.

The survey is designed to be completed in approximately 30 minutes and all responses are anonymous. Although respondents can't navigate away from the page, one can come back to where they left off. There is no time limit, so the respondent can stop and start on the same computer as needed.

The timeline to complete our Root Cause process will conclude on Dec. 12th, so NYU is requesting our timely support to complete the survey. I have requested our principals to work with you and figure out a way for you to complete this requirement as part of prep time or perhaps dedicating a faculty or staff meeting for this purpose.
