#### Parent Expectations:

Parents should play an active role in the monitoring of their child's progress by:

- Checking their posted grades in Infinite Campus weekly
- Checking their attendance
- Checking their classwork and homework regularly
- Emailing their child's teacher, school counselor or administration for their child's progress
- Setting high expectations for their child's progress
- Asking your child what they learned in class
- Parents should communicate freely with the building stakeholders regarding any changes or concerns

#### Teacher Expectations:

- All assignments that are assigned will NOT be optional and will be graded accordingly.
- Begin with grade level content from the start- assess missing knowledge and skills and provide support for specific students.
- SRI testing at least twice this year to gauge reading levels whether it is remote learning or hybrid.
- Utilize digital benchmark assessments to track progress.
- Provide multiple methods of instruction to support all students with an appropriate academic program.
- Provide feedback to parents via the Parent Summary function on Google Classroom weekly.

#### Parent/guardian email summaries

When guardians join Classroom, they receive regular email summaries for each of their students. Guardians choose the frequency of the emails—daily or weekly—and can unsubscribe at any time.

Missing work—Work that's late at the time the email was sent
Upcoming work—Work that's due today and tomorrow (for daily emails) or
work that's due in the upcoming week (for weekly emails)
Class activity—Announcements, assignments, and questions recently
posted by teachers
