Time: 6pm- 11pm (bus departs from the Riverfront at 5:15pm)

Below is a list of guidelines for students who are planning on attending the PHS Class of 2017 Prom

- PHS students should attend the recommended Drunk Driving Presentation in May, held by the Peekskill Police Department
- Ticket includes transportation, dinner, dessert, favor and entertainment
- Students are strongly encouraged to attend school on Thursday, June 1, 2017
- Tickets must be purchased by May 19th, unless the busses fill up prior to that date, then no more tickets will be sold
- Tickets and deposits may not be refunded, except in emergency situations

Mandatory Guidelines:

- PHS students and their guests must be in good academic and behavioral standing.
- All students must be transported to the Prom via Coach bus provided by PHS (if you miss the bus, you may not be allowed into the prom and may not be refunded)
- Guests who are not PHS students will be permitted but must meet the following requirements:
 - Currently in 11th or 12th grade in High School or have graduated in 2016
 - Must have the non-PHS guest form signed by May, 22, 2017
 - Must bring ID to the prom for admittance

Mandatory Guidelines Continued:

- Each student is allowed one guest; guests must be students from the classes of 2017 or 2018 (11th or 12th grade). ALL guests must have the appropriate permission slip signed by 5/22/17.
- Parents/Guardians and student must attend a night meeting on <u>May 23</u>,
 <u>2017</u> and sign the prom contract (you will not be allowed to the prom if your parent/guardian does not attend)
- Students may take their own transportation from the Prom, however a signed parental consent must be submitted by <u>5/22/17</u>
- NO backpacks/bags will be allowed into the prom venue, expect small evening bags for ladies
- If you exit the prom you will not be allowed back into the prom venue
- Dress Code- This is a formal event
 - Ladies, a formal dress is required for all who attend the prom. No dress that is above mid-thigh will be permitted. No two-piece dresses that reveal the midriff or any extremely low cut dresses will be permitted. Dresses with slits to the mid-thigh are permitted. Good taste is expected.
 - Gentleman, a tuxedo or a suit is required with a tie or bowtie.
 Students wearing jeans, shorts, sneakers or boots will not be permitted into the venue.
- If you have questions about the appropriateness of your dress, you are asked to bring in a picture of your dress. Students will not be permitted on the bus if they do not follow the dress code guidelines and may not be refunded.
- If you have been denied permission to attend the prom due to academic or behavioral standing, you can appeal the decision. Please see Dr. Ferris or Mr. Turner and a committee will review your request.
