Program Expectations

Students attending **PHS Summer Success Academy** are expected to follow the same rules outlined in the code of conduct. Students are reminded of the following:

- Cell phones are not permitted
- Dress code will be enforced
- No hoodies, du-rags, scarves
- No flip flops or slippers
- No see through shirts, halter tops, belly shirts, spaghetti straps, tube tops or plunging necklines
- Shorts, skirts and dresses no shorter than 3 inches above the knee

Students who are registered to take 2 courses, must remain in the building in between sessions.

Classroom Expectations

Behavioral Expectations/ Consequences

Students are expected to follow the rules that are outlined in the code of conduct. Students who fail to adhere to expectations will meet with administration for an initial conference. If a 2nd conference is required because of a similar behavior a parent meeting will be scheduled, with school administration. If a 3rd infraction occurs this can be grounds for removal from summer school.

Attendance Policy/ Consequences

Students are required to be in summer school everyday, on time. Students who will be out for an excused absence are required to bring in a written note or have a guardian contact the summer school counselor. After the 2nd absence, a student will be put on an attendance contract.
