Mr. Pitaccio of 1619 Magnolia Avenue handed in two (2) transportation petitions to the BOE, one for grades 6-8 and the other for grades 9-12.

Robin Heyward of 120 Franklin St. thanked the BOE and said how it must be challenging to prioritize. Ms. Heyward wanted to know is the District obligated to put a transportation petition to a vote again since this was done last year? President Smith commented that any petition can be submitted. It is at the Boards' discretion to put it as a referendum for the citizens to vote on. There are only a small percentage of students that would benefit the use of transportation in arades 6 - 12.

Dave Rengali stated he didn't have opportunity to vote last year because the referendum only included grades K - 5. He believes if we have a strong public system with a wide array of private options we should be able to co-exist. We should be working together to educate all students to be functional, intelligent citizens. Mr. Rengali would like for the Board to let the democratic process take place and allow the petition to be placed on the ballot.

Dean Diperro of 1618 Magnolia Avenue commented that we all part of the same community and no one has the right to tell him what school his child should attend. Peekskill is a diverse community and he does not want it to change.

Branwen MacDonald commented she was pleased with the advocacy on the budget. She is not in favor of transportation for grades 6-12 and the District might have to go back to neighborhood schools. Bussing was administered as a result of the Princeton Plan. To spend 1.5 million dollars does not make financial sense to add bussing.

Mr. O'Shaughnessy of Garden Court stated his children attend St. Elizabeth Ann Seton School and many students there receive scholarships. Whereas in previous years, his children received transportation, this past year he has been car-pooling. It seems every year we go through the bussing issue. Mr. O'Shaughnessy thinks PCSD is doing a wonderful job and he has noticed an improvement at the high school. He would like for the Board to allow the transportation issue be put to a vote. If the community is strong against it, they will make it known.

Mia Shervington of Poplar Circle commented she appreciates private school as being a graduate of one of them. After an exhaustive review of different school districts she did acknowledge if she selected a private school, transportation cost would be factored in her decision. The broader picture for her is what a district is able to do. Peekskill is a walkable district. Everyone has the opportunity to send their child to whatever school they would like, but they must also factor in any transportation cost. Maybe there is a possibility of making a reasonable plan for everyone, to be put in place.

Ramon Fernandez thanked the staff for use of the athletic fields for his soccer program. He commented this was the same conversation the District was having last year regarding transportation and you don't have to be a part of something to do something for your community. Mr. Fernandez said he wasn't for either side. When you come together as a whole community and participate, it makes it more interesting. He made the suggestion of liking to see a customer service department, where you listen to everyone's complaint and find a solution for the customer. Some may not have students in the District but they are our future customers. The BOE should go to the community and listen and resolve problems. You would have a better school. Those that send their children to private schools it is for their faith.

Dr. Fine commented customer service is very important and the District is always looking for a way to find a, "yes" answer to a problem. The District is aware of all the factors in the bussing situation.

Councilman Andre Rainey stated it is good to see people of the community come out and speak. He commented it is hard to come up with a budget and he appreciates the professionalism. He thanked the Board for all their hard work and asked if there is anything he can do. To piggyback on the customer service comment, he said it is a small gap to bridge. After working with the superintendent, he appreciates all the effort that is put in.

Frank Lilos commented to the Board he felt the termination of his position was unfair.
