A. Public Participation at Board Meetings

The following comments were submitted online:

Rev. George Coniglio of 1840 Crompond Rd wrote: It is with upmost respect and concern for our community that I encourage the School District to replace in classroom classes with remote learning. The sudden increase in local covid cases and hospitalizations requires us to come together to protect our young people. If there is a need, I would like to suggest exploring various means to fund equipment to those families without internet access. I would be willing to support such efforts. God Bless and stay safe.

Ariel Ferguson of 243 Depew Street wrote: As current data shows a rise in the number amongst teachers, parents, and children. Why is there such opposition to remote learning until things are under control? Parents are not being unreasonable to expect an honest answer in regards to this question.

Amy of 117 Wells Street wrote: I honestly do not feel safe than my children go to school due to the rise in cases. As a parent were supposed to be the voice for our children. I stand with many other parents on saying please switch them to remote until at least the numbers start going down.

Malinda of 1314 Crompond Road wrote: The safest place for the children is at home. Right now how do we feel safe to send them to school with many other children and teachers that do not wear the mask the right way in a class of 24 students? There's no way to keep them 6 feet apart. I believe remote is the best right now. Unless the numbers start going down, I do not feel safe for my children in school. How can we expect them to learn when they're worried about the person that coughed or sneezed? Our children need to be home.

Judi Lewis Ockler of 424 Smith Street wrote: Where is the detailed plan in place to accommodate for remote learning, particularly for the arts programs? Peekskill Middle School has been without a drama instructor since September. The substitutes have ranged from the Social Studies teacher, and English major sub who had no previous experience in drama, and another who led them in a game of hide and seek for the entire period. Currently, there is no drama teacher supervising the spring performance; they supposedly open in two weeks, and they haven't begun to work on the second half of the show. Today, my child watched a video online for chorus class. I consider it unacceptable as a working professional in the arts to know that our school's athletic programs remain open while the rest of the schools' programs go virtual-often without teacher supervision or instruction or get canceled. Dr. Mauricio reiterated answers from the COVID Update (see PowerPoint) stressing the challenges students face with virtual learning as opposed to in person learning. Due to staffing issues, the high school and middle school will move to remote learning January 5 – 7.

**** Classroom Teachers with two years of Jarema Act Credit in this school district shall serve a two-year probationary term if during the two years of Jarema Act service they received APPR ratings pursuant to §§3012-c and/or 3012-d of the Education Law. Where the probationary term is shortened, to be eligible for tenure conferral, the probationer must have at least three effective and/or highly effective APPR ratings and the APPR rating in the final year of probation may not be an ineffective rating.
