Newcomer Program

Peekskill City School District's Newcomer Program has been established to educate and support students and families who are recent arrivals to the United States. It serves all students pre-k-12 who have had little to no formal schooling, or those who have had severely interrupted education. Eligible students are identified at the Welcome Center (registration office) and provided a welcoming packet with information pertinent to the district and home school. The goal of the program is to prepare newcomer students for success in academic programs by acquiring proficiency in English language skills and the content knowledge appropriate for graduation, college/university readiness, career training, and social awareness. Our building and classroom support ranges from dual language, bi-lingual courses, and ELL experts at each grade level. Our teachers have been trained in various models with respect to ELL strategies such as Sheltered Instruction Observation Protocol (SIOP) to Language acquisition and literacy based approaches.



Secondary Alignment

We are currently uploading common core aligned curriculum to Rubicon Atlas, a web based curriculum management tool, which allows all teachers to align curriculum to common core state standards. Our department leaders allow for vertical and horizontal alignment across all secondary grades, 6-12. We have five leaders in each school all charged to design both interdisciplinary planning opportunities and a seamless curriculum connected to state standards and district goals. The CIA Plan is led by the Assistant Superintendents and facilitated by the Teacher Leaders. The CIA CORE Team's primary responsibility is to monitor all curriculum, instruction, and assessment projects or initiatives to ensure that curricular or programmatic actions are taken with the district's strategic objectives in mind. The CORE team considers recommendations from the Content Area Teams and makes final decisions about all matters of curriculum, instruction, and assessment based upon the district's mission, vision, and values.

Theater/Drama
