Elementary Continued Learning: Phase II

Our elementary Distance Learning program is moving into its second phase, continuing with opportunities for both online and traditional paper-based learning for our Pre-K- Grade 5 students. This will provide our families with two options based on their needs. Phase II resources include teacher selected online videos, materials and activities, as well as pre-printed/print-from-home educational resources for students who work best with hard copy materials. These resources will continue to be enhanced as we move forward. Currently, our elementary teachers are participating in Google Classroom training to assist in aligning our elementary Continued Learning experiences with those of our secondary buildings. Many elementary teachers are already engaging in on-line Google Classroom instruction.

Elementary (Pre-K -Grade 5) Continued Learning packet pick-up will be available Monday, April 13 -Friday, April 17 from 10 a.m. - 12 p.m. at Oakside Elementary and Peekskill High School. Distribution will be self-service. Please be sure to pick your child's packet from the appropriate grade level bin. These resources will also be available on building websites as of Monday, April 13 for the option of printing at home.

Parents, please remember to have students continue to check online for daily messages from building principals and teachers. These messages can be found on Teacher pages and/or Google Classrooms. If you or your child are experiencing any difficulties with the online format, please reach out to your child's teacher.

Secondary Exams

This week, the NYS Board of Regents issued a statement which included the cancellation of the June **Regents Exams**. For a detailed explanation of what this means for our students, please <u>read this</u> <u>press release</u> from the NYS Department of Education. You can also see this list of <u>Frequently Asked</u> <u>Questions (FAQs)</u> for more information regarding Regents and graduation requirements. Additional guidance regarding the August administration of the Regents Exams will be released at a later date.

Please note that students taking Spanish I and Spanish III will also be exempt from the State's **Spanish Exams** as long as they finish the class with a passing grade and earn credit for the course.

The **College Board's Advanced Placement Exams** remain scheduled for May. Students will be receiving additional information regarding AP testing from their teachers and the high school Guidance Department. The exams will be in an online format.

Technology Access:

If any student in Grade 6-12 does not have access to technology to complete their assigned school work, please visit Uriah Hill Elementary on Tuesday, April 14 or Thursday, April 16 from 9:30 a.m.-12:30 p.m. to sign out a Chromebook. A parent or guardian must come to complete the appropriate paperwork.

Meal Distribution:

As a reminder, our breakfast and lunch "Grab and Go" bags continue to be served Monday - Friday to any Peekskill student to bring home. Distribution will take place from 10 a.m. - 12 p.m. at Oakside Elementary and Peekskill High School. Feeding Westchester is also proving non-perishables as part of the grab and go program during these times. Families can visit either site. A big thank you to our food service, security and custodians for all of your hardwork and dedication to provide healthy meals to our families.

In closing, I'd like to take a moment to share that our District's Continued Learning efforts were featured as the cover story for the April 6 edition of the New York State School Board Association's newspaper, On Board.
