Elementary Belongings Pick-Up/Student Drop-Off

If you are walking, you must wear a mask and observe social distancing guidelines. Staff will bring your child's belongings to your car or to you. Instruments must be returned this week as well at Oakside and Hillcrest Schools. Uriah Hill will return student's belongings during the Pre-Kindergarten graduation car parade ceremony on Tuesday, June 16. Uriah Hill families that are walking to the parade are required to wear masks and maintain social distancing to receive their child's belongings and graduation certificate. Class of 2020 Graduation Parade

I recently met with City leadership, including the Chief of Police, to discuss the idea of a Class of 2020 car parade. Due to the large number of cars participating (approximately 250), I proposed a route that would address the safety concerns shared and which avoids streets with heavy pedestrian traffic. Additionally, during our last parade we found that there were numerous streets with little to no community engagement. Therefore, I proposed a route that would help ensure safe passage and allow the community to line the streets in a socially distanced way while limiting participation gaps. This will truly be an exhilarating experience for our graduates and the parents / guardians driving them. We invite you all to join us on Friday, June 26 at 10:30 a.m. for this car parade celebrating the graduating Class of 2020! Please show our seniors your support by lining up on the street to cheer them on as they pass. Also, please remember to practice social distancing procedures and wear a mask. High School Graduation Update:

We considered an outdoor graduation when the Governor allowed a maximum of 150 people to assemble. This limited number would have required six graduation ceremonies at Depew Field. The field would not have allowed us to erect a tent as it would block the view of the graduates from the bleachers. Therefore, students would have been on the field in their caps and gowns for approximately one hour in direct sunlight or potentially in the rain. Instead we enhanced our plans to provide our students and their families with a ceremonial experience. We created a video to showcase the special plans for this exciting day!
