School Closure Grading:

Peekskill High School and Peekskill Middle School: 3rd Quarter Grading

What is the philosophy that governs grading during the COVID-19 school closure?

Our priority is to ensure that no student is unfairly impacted by this drastic shift in his/her school and learning experience. In keeping in line with a "do no harm" philosophy, we want to do our best to assist students to continue their learning while trying to support the social and emotional needs of our community and students. As such, our grading plan is as follows:

- Focuses on the essential learning in order to prepare students for the next step in their educational experience.
- Takes into account that everyone has circumstances that are outside of their control.
- Takes into account the social emotional impact of the current situation.

• Recognizes the lack of access to an equitable learning environment including wifi access.

How are the 3rd quarter grades being calculated?

In light of these unprecedented circumstances, Peekskill High School and Peekskill Middle School will be adopting a "No Harm" approach to grading for the 3rd and 4th quarters while expecting students to remain engaged in their learning throughout the closure.

• 3rd Quarter (*Ending April 24th*): Grades for 3rd quarter will be a Pass or Incomplete. We will not use numerical grades for the 3rd quarter. We were approximately halfway through our third quarter when we closed schools on March 13th. Students will be provided the opportunity to make up any missed work that was assigned between January 27th and March 12th, without penalty. Students will not be allowed to get an average lower than what their average was on March 13th. During this time, teachers will support students in catching up on their essential learning, provide new learning lessons for AP and Regents classes and may be assigning enrichment assignments to keep students engaged.

All high school courses that are assessed as a "Pass" will be granted credit toward graduation requirements.

What is a Pass?

A pass will be left to the discretion of the classroom teacher. The teacher will return assignments/projects with comments. The comments will explain the changes that need to be made in order to make an assignment acceptable as a passing assignment.

What is an Incomplete?

Students who do not complete assignments by the end of the Quarter will be assigned an incomplete for that course. The teacher will correspond to the student whose assignments need to be completed in a reasonable amount of time to be given a "Pass". Students will have two weeks to make up assignments. The due date will be May 15th.

What will I see on my report card ?

You will either see a P (pass) or an INC (Incomplete) If you get an INC - be sure to find out what you need to do to have the grade changed to a P (pass).

Will this affect my Grade Point Average (GPA) ?

No - the Pass / Incomplete approach will not negatively impact your GPA.

Will my transcript permanently have a P or an INC grade?

No. The transcript will have a real grade for the course at the end of the year. There are still many unanswered questions surrounding the assignment of grades. We fully understand that GPA's are critical, and we want to be sure that our decisions put all of our students in the best possible GPA scenario.

NYS Regents exams are cancelled. What does this mean to students?

Yes, Regents Exams are cancelled. As well at the LOTE Checkpoint A and B Oneida Exam. If you are in a Regents course it is CRITICAL that you keep the highest level of expectations as possible. If you pass the course you will get Regents Credit for Graduation purposes on the Regents.

NYSED <u>announced the cancellation of the June 2020 administration of Regents</u> <u>Exams</u> and released <u>guidance on modifications to requirements</u> for students to graduate and earn their high school diplomas, credentials, and endorsements.

Will the teachers assign tests or quizzes?

Because there is value in this type of assessment, this decision will be made by individual teachers.

• 4th Quarter (*Begins April 27th*)

We are finalizing the grading structure for the 4th quarter. Teachers will provide feedback on specific assignments and indicate mastery/proficiency through comments. All assignments during this time will help keep students engaged in their learning and support advancement to the next course. All grades will be put in the online gradebook that can be found on Parent Portal.

• How will final grades be calculated?

A final calculation is still being discussed.

• What should I do if my student needs academic support?

If you are concerned about your child's academic performance, please contact the child's teacher first or his guidance counselor. You can then contact the building administration. The district directory has all the email addresses.

Multilingual Education

Peekskill City School District's Multilingual programs serve children in Pre-K through grade twelve. Our Dual Language program provides students the opportunity to learn academic content in English and Spanish by certified teachers experienced in working with language learners. PCSD serves students through a *two-way model (two teachers designated to one of the two languages)* and a *oneway* model (*one teacher responsible for teaching both languages*). Peekskill's English as a New Language program supports English language acquisition to students new to the country in two formats: a *stand-alone* ENL class where instruction is provided by a NYS certified TESOL teacher, and *integrated classes* where ELLs receive ENL supports from an ENL teacher in a content area class (*i.e., ELA, Math, Science, Social Studies*).
