Superintendent's Communication Brief: November 13 - 16, 2018

On Tuesday, Dr. Mauricio began the week with a regularly scheduled school support visit to Woodside Elementary. He was joined by Assistant Superintendent Dr. Foster, Director of Special Services Mrs. Gerace, Technology Manager Mrs. Reid and Woodside Principal Mrs. Aviles-Rodriguez. The group discussed the Walk-to-Model of literacy instruction, professional development provided by Mrs. Aviles-Rodriguez and toured the building. While visiting classrooms, the team saw evidence of literacy instruction, creative bulletin boards and students engaged in sustained reading. The students are building up their reading stamina, which is a school goal.

It will be presented at this week's BOE meeting along with a presentation from Mrs. Vargas, Director of Uriah Hill.



Later Tuesday afternoon, Dr. Mauricio joined Director of Special Services Mrs. Gerace and Parent, Family and Community Engagement Liaison Mrs. Olivier-Flores in a meeting with Arts10566 representatives Mr. Morel and Mr. Mora to discuss their engagement in our Saturday Academy, Parent Center and the potential adoption of one or two of our schools. Mr. Mora was very impressed with our parent and family engagement efforts.



Following the Arts10566 meeting, Dr. Mauricio joined Peekskill Mayor Rainey and Councilman Colin Smith to meet with Mount Lebanon Pastor Gary Colter at City Hall to discuss the church's support of the MBK initiative. Pastor Colter expressed his interest in joining our MBK and Saturday Academy efforts.



Tuesday evening, Dr. Mauricio joined community stakeholders at an Arts10566 ribbon cutting event at the organization's new location on John Walsh Blvd. Peekskill students in Arts10566's violin classes participated in the ceremony by playing for those in attendance.
