The Peekskill City School District has arranged a "Grab & Go" Breakfast/Lunch Program for students during our COVID-19 closures. Breakfast and lunch "grab and go" bags will be served Monday - Friday to any Peekskill student to bring home. We are also providing warm meals. As of March 30, our pick-up locations will be combined to include only the Oakside and Peekskill High School sites. Distribution will take place in these two school building parking lots. Families can visit either site from 10AM-12PM. Please note that during our scheduled Spring Recess, meals will be available Monday, April 6 thru Thursday, April 9 ONLY. There will be NO meal service on Friday, April 10. A special thanks goes out to Food Service Director Mr. Andrew Wiesman and his staff for helping to prepare and serve meals to our families! Additional thanks to Assistant Superintendent Mrs. Robin Zimmerman for her leadership in coordinating this effort, to Director of Security Mr. David Santiago and our security staff for helping to keep each location organized, and to our administrators and staff who volunteered to assist.



Our Board of Education ventured into unchartered territories this week as our District held its first remote Board meeting. We are happy to say the effort went well and we will follow this format for our future meetings while buildings remain closed. At the Board meeting, district administrators and staff presented on our work over the last two weeks. 
