PCSD Parent, Family and Community Liason Mrs. Maria Olivier-Flores also presented at the meeting. Mrs. Olivier-Flores spoke about our Saturday Academy and Parent Center, noting that we've connected with 70+ community partners and served 2,900+ families since the Academy's launch on Nov. 3!



Coordinator of Student Support Services Ms. Sadika Clarke welcomed students and teachers for the first official Girls Global Alliance meeting at Peekskill High School this week. The group, which focuses on women's empowerment, discussed plans for the upcoming school year.

Dr. Mauricio, Assistant Superintendent for Business Mrs. Robin Zimmerman and Director of Facilities Mr. Carmine Crisci met with architects this week to discuss a project timeline and the scope of work for the District's proposed capital project referendum, which will be voted on by the community in October 2019. This project proposes facility enhancements at each school including a STEM lab at Hillcrest; transforming Torpy field into a multi-use turf field and creating a STEAM Innovation Center at the high school to focus on Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics. We look forward to sharing more details with the community in the near future.


city will be awarded \$10 million to develop a downtown strategic investment plan and implement key catalytic projects that advance the community's vision for revitalization.
