Superintendent's Communication Brief: November 4-November 8, 2019

Last Saturday, students from the PKMS Chorus, the PHS Chorus, the PHS City Singers, Hillcrest Strings students and Oakside Strings students all had the opportunity to share the Paramount Theater stage with local violinist Daisy Jopling. Ms. Jopling concluded her performance by making a donation to the Peekskill City School District's music program. Our District's first Pre-K-12 Math Council Meeting was held this week and led by Director of STEM Dr. Anchala Sobrin. All grade levels were represented by teacher leaders and school administrators joined as well. Math Council members engaged in using the Question Formulation Technique (QFT) to begin defining our collective vision. The council will meet once a month beginning in January to continue aligning our Math curriculum and plan the implementation of the Next Generation Math Standards. Dr. Sobrin also hosted a Pre-K - 12 STEM Council Meeting this week. Educators representing all grade levels used QFT to generate questions that will be addressed as PCSD continues to develop our vision for STEAM education in the future.



On Tuesday, November 5, Peekskill administrators, faculty and staff participated in a day of Professional Development. Groups gathered to participate in workshops and classes at Peekskill CSD, while others attended conferences outside of the District. Topics of focus for the day included Curriculum Best Practices, Literacy, Math, technology trainings, CPR/First Aid for teacher aides and more.

Dr. Mauricio met with Ms. Karen Faulkner of Inner Being Yoga this week to discuss updates on our District's current yoga programs. Currently Ms. Faulkner offers yoga classes for students with special needs through our Special Education Parent Teacher Organization (SEPTO), on Fridays in our schools during physical education classes and for entire families at our Saturday Academies.



This week, PCSD Director of STEM Dr. Anchala Sobrin welcomed visitors from Clarkson University's Beacon Institute for Rivers and Estuaries. President/CEO Dr. Michael Walsh and Director of Environmental Programs Mr. Asher Pacht spent the day with Dr. Sobrin and PCSD leaders to discuss developing partnerships that will benefit our students and staff.



Dr. Mauricio and District leadership met this week to review our new District dashboard system, Tableau. This software will help District staff analyze data as Peekskill CSD continues to work towards the Board of Education's goal of improving data driven decision making. This dashboard will be rolled out shortly.



Woodside Technology Teaching Assistant Ms. Jessica Rondon recently participated in a panel on Digital Wellness at the Lower Hudson Regional Information Center's Tech Summit. Ms. Rondon spoke about the importance of educating both families and students (from a very young age) to find balance when using digital devices. Ms. Rondon also recapped her lessons from Woodside, where she teaches students about being good digital citizens, as well as how to be safe, responsible and respectful behind the screen.



As part of his weekly School Supports visits, Dr. Mauricio was joined by District administrators at Hillcrest Elementary. The leadership team had the opportunity to discuss technology upgrades, visit math classrooms, observe student written work on bulletin boards, visit Dual Language classrooms, and view literacy instruction during the "What I Need" (WIN) period. During the visit, students were seen engaged in real world problem solving and delving deeper into their understanding of mathematical concepts. The group also observed students creating their own websites using Chromebook tablets.



This week, Hillcrest Elementary celebrated Multicultural Night at the school. The evening consisted of food from around the globe, performances from the Peekskill Dance Fusion group, international games, dancing, artifacts and more! Thank you to the families and staff who volunteered to make this night a success, and to Principal Mr. Lichtenwalner and Assistant Principal O'Grady for their efforts in hosting the event.



This week, Assistant Superintendent for Secondary Education Mr. Dan Callahan, Director of Special Services Mrs. Ellen Gerace, Peekskill High School Assistant Principal Dr. Jenna Ferris and PHS teacher Ms. Christine Buckman visited the BOCES Tilly Foster Farm program in Brewster, NY. The purpose of the visit was to continue conversations with PNW BOCES, Westchester Community College and Hudson Hospitality group regarding a potential culinary program in Peekskill. The visit included tours of the Tilly Foster kitchen, restaurant area and classrooms. The group discussed work-based experiences for students, as well as the possibility of internships in the fields of hospitality and culinary.
