During the meeting, the team reviewed the day's details and discussed opportunities for improvements as we continue to move forward in a virtual model until September 21. We have worked on and improved our teacher's wifi access. We appreciate everyone's patience as we work through some lingering challenges that are facing regional school districts.



Members of our Athletic Department were on hand at the backpack giveaway to distribute our Physical Education to-go bags to students in Grades K-5. It was so great to see our students using these supplies during their first PE classes. Thank you again to the PTO for helping to support this initiative. Also, thank you Athletic Director Austin Goldberg and the physical education teachers for volunteering their time to hand out the equipment to students.



Peekskill administrators recently boarded a bus and rode to each school in our district to do a "dry run" of arrival procedures with building principals and staff. Upon arrival, these "students" had their temperatures taken, were instructed where to enter the buildings, and were asked to use the hand sanitizer stations as they entered our schools. To ensure our staff are prepared to address a variety of scenarios on the first day of student attendance, which is on September 21, our administrative team presented school leaders with a variety of "what-if" situations. We would like to inform our student-athletes and their families, as well as our PCSD sports fans, that at this time, the New York State Department of Health has labeled Cross Country, Soccer, Traditional Cheer and Girls Swimming low-risk and the Section One Executive Committee has approved the start of these sports starting September 29. Football, Competitive Cheer and Volleyball have been labeled high-risk and have had their start date moved to March 2021. Please note, Section 1 Athletics may move Girls Swimming to March 2021 due to lack of pool availability of majority of Section 1 schools. If you are the parent of a student-athlete, please have them register for FamilyID, as this is the best way for our Athletics Department and Coaches to communicate with families as we receive more information and updates.
