- a. Passage 1- Discuss one passage that describes the main character;
- b. Passage 2- Discuss one passage that reveals the setting and establish the mood;
- c. Passage 3- Discuss one passages that develops the plot (**exposition, conflict, climax, resolution**);
- d. Passage 4- Discuss one passage that communicates the theme;
- e. Passage 5- Discuss one passage in order to analyze the use of figurative language.
