## **BOCES/** Career and Tech Experience

A wide array of programs are available to Tech Center at Yorktown students who want to develop new career skills and earn college credit.

Teenagers can gain a competitive edge by enrolling in one of **40 Career and Technical Education courses** in the areas of:

- Arts and Humanities
- Business
- Engineering
- Health
- Human and Public Services
- Natural and Agricultural Sciences

In addition, academic credit is offered in English, Math, Science or Social Studies as well as college credit in many of the exciting programs.

The Tech Center offers students an opportunity to attend for one or two years, for two or four hours each day.

Successful graduates can attain a Career and Technical Education Certificate or a Regents Diploma with a Technical Endorsement.

The success rate is high, with 80% going on to colleges or technical institutions and 20% working in their field of study. Clubs, competitions and honor societies round out the Tech Center experience.

## Naviance College Search

### To conduct a college search:

- Begin by clicking on the "Colleges" tab toward the top right side of the home page
- Click on "Find your Fit"
- Next, click on "Advanced College Search"
- Enter the criteria you're looking for in a college (i.e. major, location, cost, etc) and click **"View Matches"**

Once the list of colleges is generated, you can learn more about each individual school by clicking on the college name. This will provide you with information on tuition, acceptance rates, graduation rates, deadlines, and majors, as well as, provide a realistic assessment of your chances of admission at colleges where prior graduates have applied.

You can also save colleges to your "Favorites" list by clicking on the heart icon in the college profile page.

### To search for a specific college:

- Click on the "Colleges" tab toward the top of the Naviance home page
- Type the college name into the search bar and click "Search"
- Once the college name is generated, click on the link to access further information on the school.

## Creating a "Colleges I'm Thinking About" list:

If you are interested in a college that you have researched, you can add it to your "Colleges I'm Thinking About" list by clicking on the heart icon next to the school name in the college's Naviance profile page.

## Ms. Lynch's Tips on Writing a Good Resume

Do you want to make a good impression on your college application or job?

Your resume is a list of all your accomplishments, so you'll want to spend some time making a list of everything you have done. Your resume should include:

- Your name and contact information
- Your educational experience
- Honors and awards you have received
- Any work or volunteer experience
- Any special skills you have
- Your objective
- Clubs, organizations, or extracurricular activities you participated in

Your resume will look organized and be easier for colleges or employers to read if you create different sections. For example, one section could be titled "Education" and another could be called "Honors and Awards".

You'll also want to include the dates of each item, and list these in order.

Finally, use *action verbs* to describe specific details about your experiences. This will really impress your readers. For example, if you volunteered, describe your experience like this: "Mentored and provided emotional support" – the action verbs are "mentored" and "provided."

## 12th Grade To Do List

#### √ Follow Up On Your Applications:

Verify with your Counselor that all forms are in order and have been sent out to colleges. Check with schools to see if they have received all of your information, including transcripts, test scores and recommendations.

- ✓ Submit Financial Aid Forms Online
- ✓ Mid-Year Grade Reports:

Most colleges ask for Mid-Year grade reports so they can keep track of your grades, so it's important to continue to work hard throughout your Senior year.

#### ✓ Watch For Notifications From Colleges:

If you applied under the Regular Application Process, you should receive an Admissions Decision during the Spring. Notification for Financial Aid Awards should arrive as well.

#### ✓ Compare Financial Packages:

Make sure to consider each financial aid award carefully. If you have questions don't hesitate to contact the financial aid office of the college to get more information. Financial Aid is a key factor in deciding where you will attend.

## **College Application Terms**

#### **Common App**

A college application that many schools use. It's where you fill out most of your application information an essays.

**Reach School** 

Your test scores are below those of the

majority of accepted students at this

type of school. Selective admissions.

#### **Early Decision**

Applying earlier and hearing back earlier. Your acceptance is binding & you must withdraw applications from other

#### Target School

You are likely to be admitted based on your academic profile.

#### **Early Action**

Applying earlier and hearing back earlier. You don't have to attend if accepted and can apply to more than one school early action.

#### **Safety School**

You have above average test scores for this school and are highly likey to get in.

### **Rolling Admissions**

Colleges with rolling admissions evaluate applications as they are received versus waiting to evaluate all applications after a hard deadline. The school will continue to review applications until they've filled all the spots for the incoming class.

#### Legacy

A legacy student is someone who has had family members attend that school. This can increase your chances of being accepted.

#### Superscore

If you've taken the SAT and/ or the ACT more than once, superscoring combines the highest score from each section (math, reading, etc.) regardless of which test it's from. Many but not all colleges do this.

#### Weighted GPA

A weighted GPA is a GPA that takes the difficulty of your classes into account along with your grades.

#### **Wait List**

The college has finished reviewing your file and made a decision to put you on a waiting list for admission.

#### **Personal Statement**

An essay you write to show who you are and why you deserve to be admitted to a particular school.
