All students are required to complete **four years (4)** of mathematics.



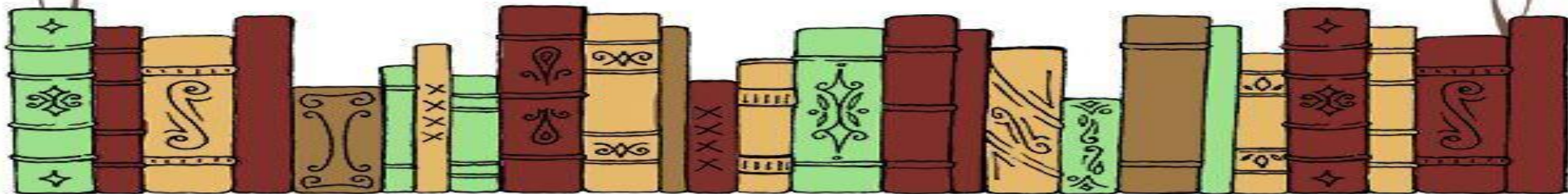

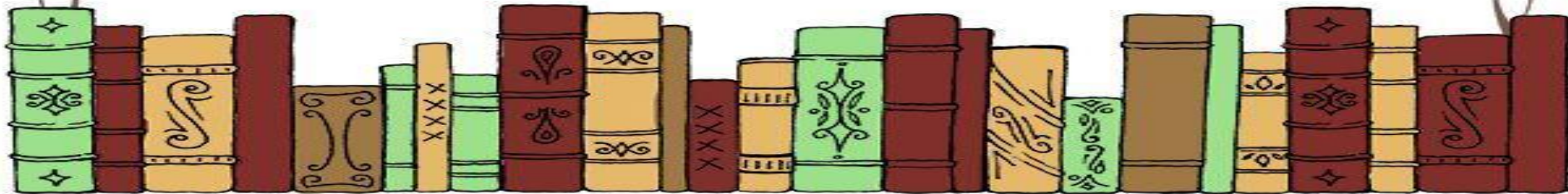

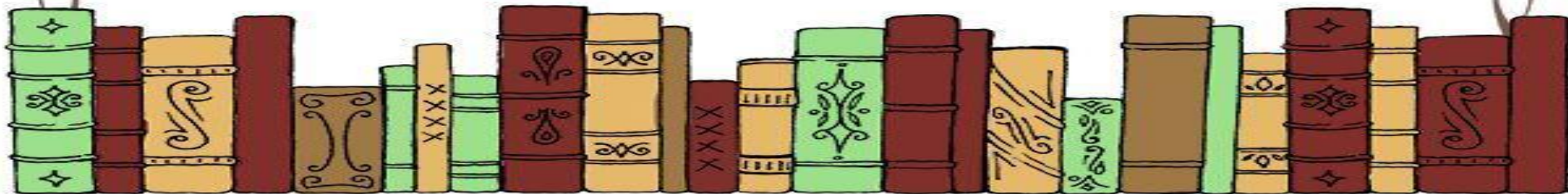
# COLLEGE ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

## 1. **GPA (Grade Point Average)/Transcript**

- GPA
- Class rank
- Senior Course Selection
  - a. Course Weighting
    - i. Electives/Regents Courses: 1.0
    - ii. Honors Courses: 1.05
    - iii. AP/College Courses: 1.1

## 2. **Standardized Test Scores**

- SAT with Writing/SAT Subject Tests OR ACT with Writing





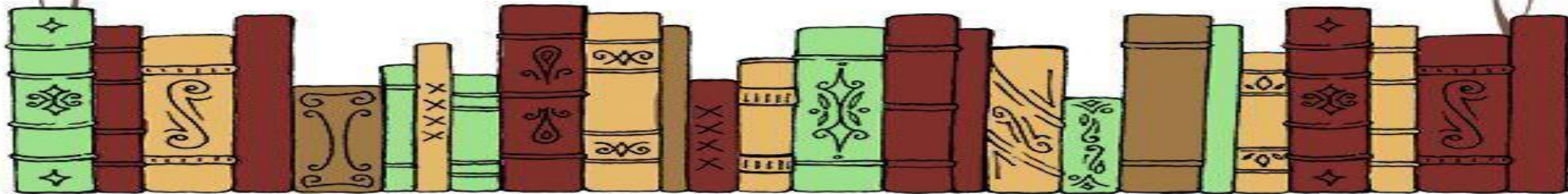
# COLLEGE ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

## 3. Letters of Recommendation :

- At least TWO (2) from core subject teachers and ONE (1) from your Counselor.
- Request the letters **NOW!**
- Counselor College of Recommendation Form can be found on Naviance under the “About Me” tab.
  - a. Students should login to Naviance daily for important information.

## 4. College Essay :

- Summer English 12 assignment was to write a first draft of your College Essay
- Tells a personal story
- Provides the admissions counselors an insight into who you are, how you think, what makes you different from others, etc.



# COLLEGE ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

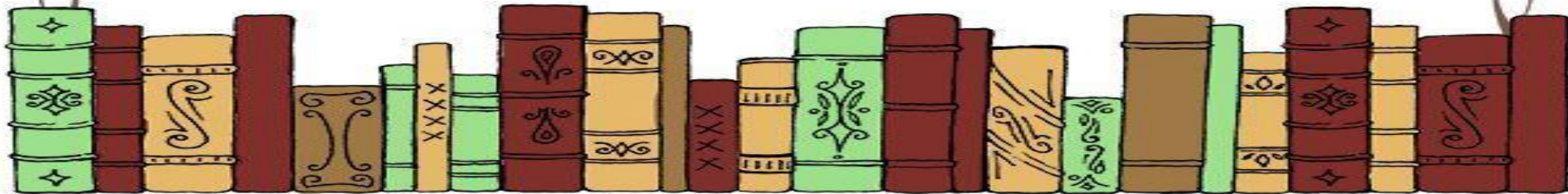
## 5. **Resume:**

-Should Includes what you have done outside the classroom: jobs, sports, community service, leadership positions, honors or awards.

## 6. **Interview:**

-Helps the admissions counselor get to know you as a person outside of your application. If colleges offer interviews, it is highly recommended that you take advantage of this.

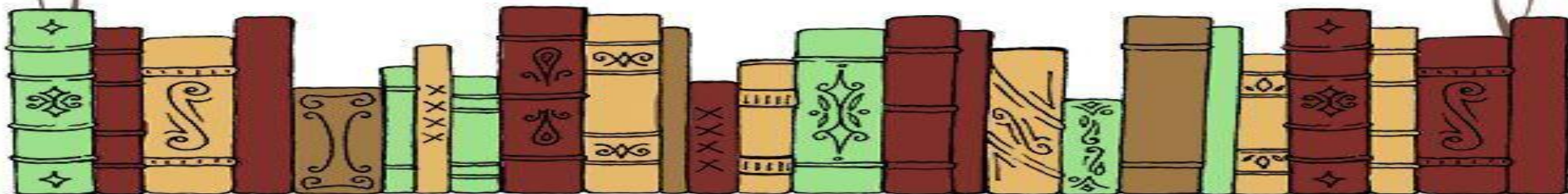

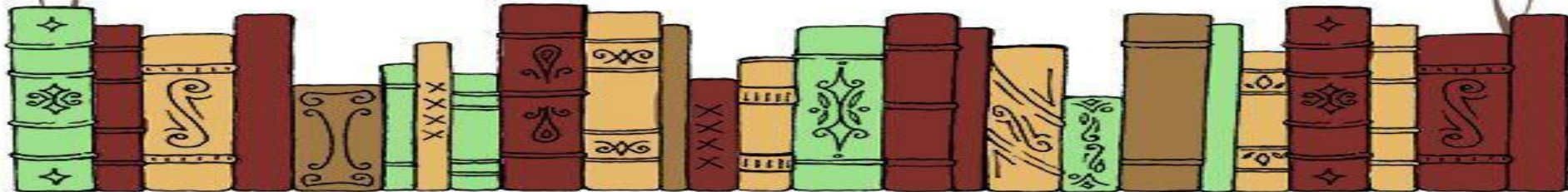
## Environmental Fit:

- In what geographical area do I want the college to be?

# COLLEGE SEARCH PROCESS

## **Safety Schools:**

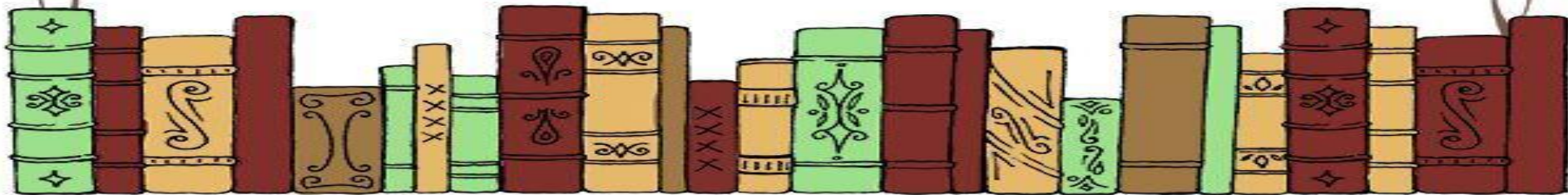
A school you will certainly get into. Your GPA & SAT/ACT Scores are higher than what the school is looking for.

## **Target School:**

A school you have a good chance of getting into. Your GPA & SAT/ACT Scores are within the range of what the school is looking for.

## **Reach School:**

Your GPA & SAT/ACT Scores are lower compared to the schools requirements.



# COLLEGE APPLICATION PROCESS

## Early Decision:

-Binding Contract - If a student is accepted, they must attend.

## Early Action\*:

-Non-Binding

-Students receive a decision letter beginning of January, if not sooner

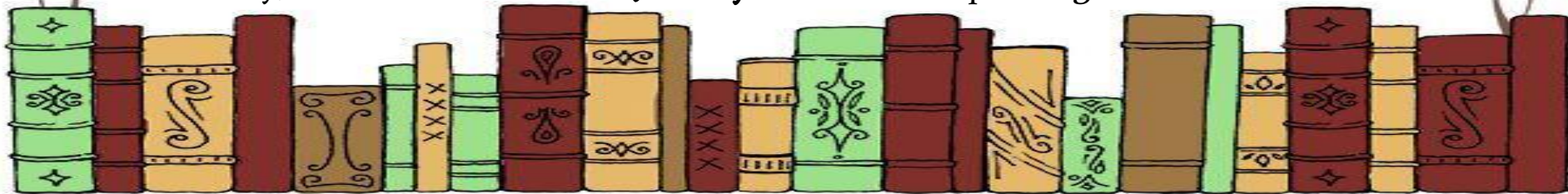
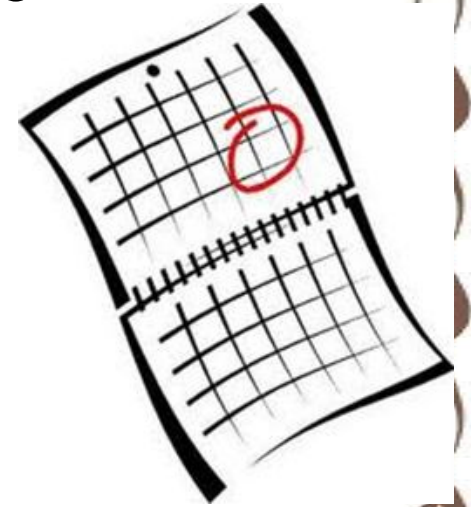
## Rolling Admissions:

-Applications are reviewed on a rolling basis

-Decision letters are sent out 3 - 4 weeks after application is reviewed

## Regular Decision:

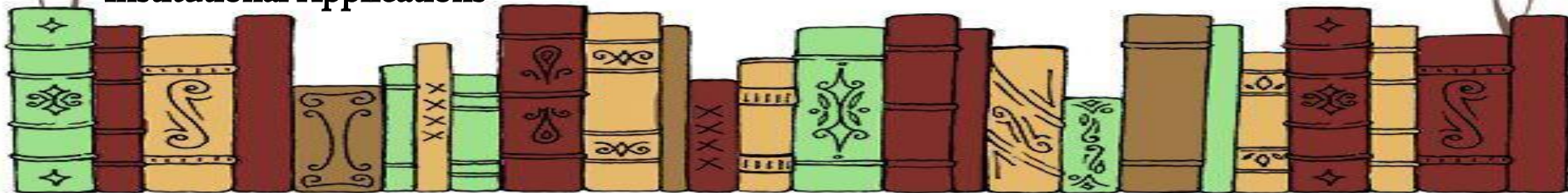
-Generally, the deadline is around **January 1st**. Differs depending on the school.



# COLLEGE APPLICATION PROCESS

- **The Common Application (CommonApp.org)**
  - With instant access to more than 700 colleges and universities around the world, the **Common App** is the most seamless way to manage the application process.
  - All supporting documents are sent out by the Counseling Office electronically through Naviance(ex. Transcript, Letters of Recommendation, School Profile, etc.).
- **The SUNY Application**
  - applySUNY is the **application** portal that allows you to complete an application for admissions
  - Many SUNY schools are also available to apply to through the Common Application
- **The CUNY Application**
  - The CUNY Portal is the application you **MUST** use if you plan to apply to a CUNY school.
  - Students can apply to up to 6 CUNY schools for the same application fee of \$70.

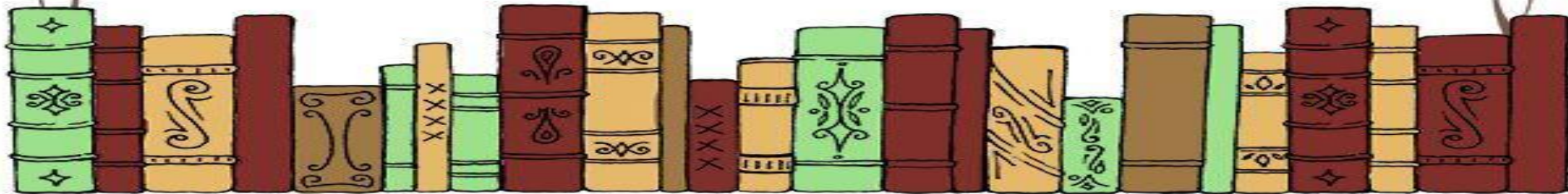


# COLLEGE APPLICATION PROCESS

## 3 Steps to Submitting a College Application:

1. Fill out and submit your application;
2. Students need to send their official test scores (SAT or ACT) through either [collegeboard.org](http://collegeboard.org) or [ACTstudent.org](http://ACTstudent.org);
3. Students need to inform their Counselor which schools they applied to so that they can send their supporting documents (Transcript, Letters of Recommendations, Resume, School Profile, etc.)

**\*Reminder: Students need to ensure their Common App and Naviance are synced\***



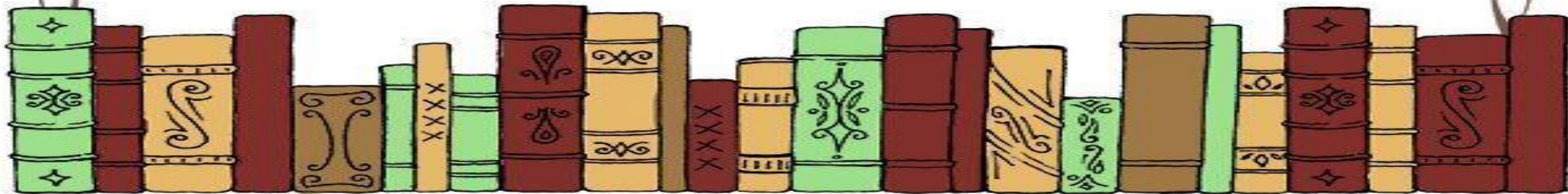

# Financial Aid: Application Types

1. **FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid)**
  - a. Must complete this online form in order to receive federal student aid.
  - b. Application is available on **October 1, 2019**.
2. **TAP (Tuition Assistance Program)**
  - a. Helps eligible New York State residents pay tuition at New York State schools.
  - b. Application is available on **October 1, 2019**
3. **CSS Profile**
  - a. Some colleges use this College Board sponsored form to determine who will receive their institutional aid.
  - b. If the schools you are applying to require this form, you will not receive financial aid if you have not completed this online form.
  - c. Application is available on **October 1, 2019**



# Financial Aid

## Types of Financial Aid:

### 1. Grants

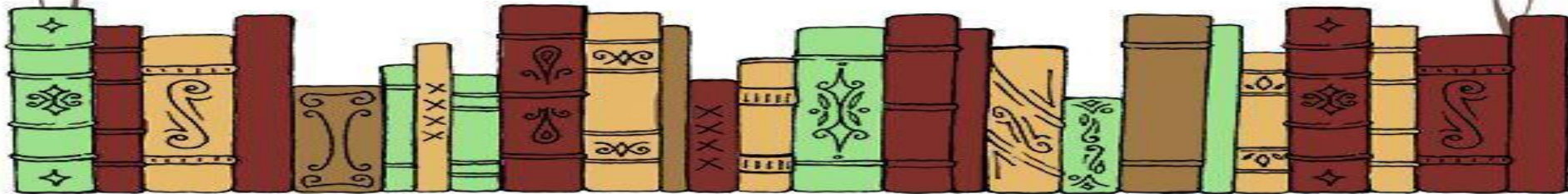
- a. Does not need to be paid back
- b. Ex. Pell Grant, TAP Grant, SEOG, Institutional Grants

### 2. Work Study

- a. A work program through which you earn money to help you pay for school

### 3. Loans

- a. Borrowed money. Must be paid back, usually with interest
- b. Government Loans
  - i. Ex. Perkins, Direct Loan Program (Subsidized/Unsubsidized Direct Stafford Loans, Parent PLUS Loan)



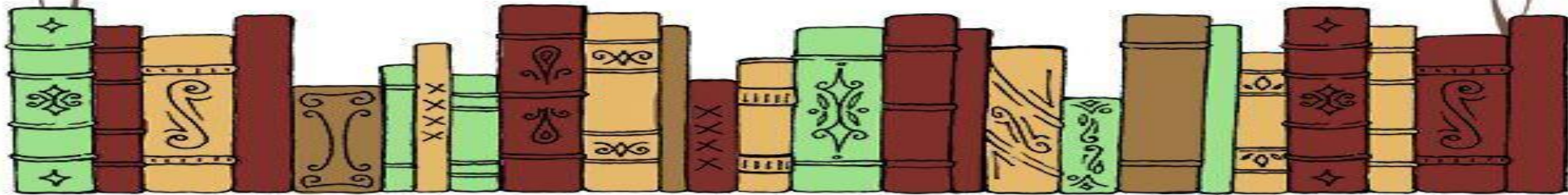

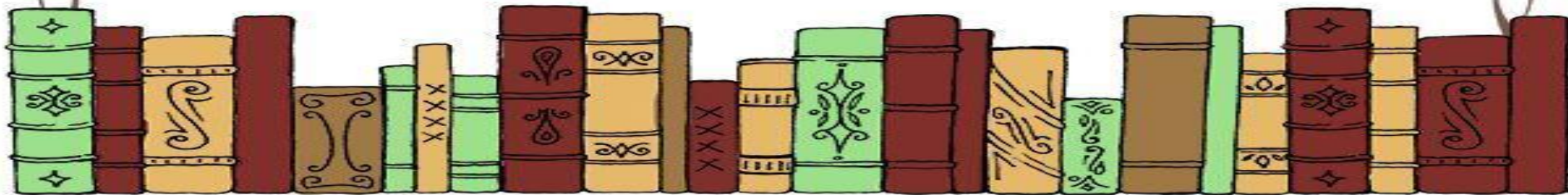

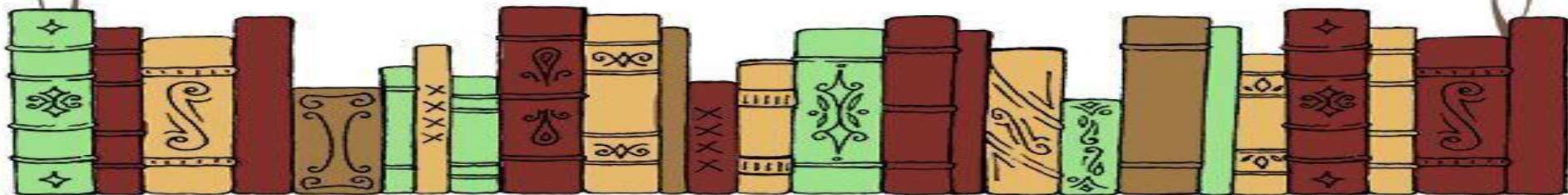
