WHAT WE ARE LEARNING THIS MONTH

Writing: Students are writing non-fiction pieces (How to Books) and are continuing to learn about the stages of writing. For example, drafting, editing and publishing. All students will publish a piece of writing at the end of the unit of study. Please discuss and support your child's writing journey daily through the following recommendations and don't forget to ask them about their publishing celebration!

At home: Pick a favorite non-fiction topic. Talk about all aspects of the topic. Draw it in a diagram. Label all its parts. (Ex. Dogs - breeds, nutrition, habitat, etc.)

Reading: Woodside readers are learning to read harder books. Students are becoming nonfiction experts and learning how to use nonfiction features to gain meaning, find patterns and decipher harder words through the use of nonfiction features.

At home: Please read to your children every night and discuss illustrations and features of nonfiction print as you read with them. Ask them to point out what they notice about each one of the features and discuss what the information was all about.

Math: Units of Measurement – Students are continuing their exploration of measurement for the next week and will then begin to work on number sentences and quick facts that make 5 including number bonds.

At home: Please support this learning by exploring how tall things are. Utilize simple objects to measure things around the house. Also please support your child with counting simple objects and making combinations of 5. For example 2 spoons + 3 forks = 5

First Grade

WHAT WE ARE LEARNING THIS MONTH

Writing: First Grade writers will begin to understand that we categorize, explain, convince and persuade people through our writing. Students will learn that writing can give students a way to make and defend important decisions. Students will learn to write judgments and to organize their reasons and supply supporting details for those reasons. All students will publish a piece of writing at the end of the unit of study. Please discuss and support your child's writing journey daily through the following recommendations and don't forget to ask them about their publishing celebration!

At home: Discuss opinions on everyday things. For example, I love pepperoni pizza and it's the best because.... I think walking to school is better than taking the school bus because... Encourage your child to give reasons and to rationalize their thinking with details. Have fun with it!

Reading: Students are learning to take ownership of their reading by learning to self monitor and to regularly utilize all their strategies and tools to read harder level texts. Readers are also being pushed to give critical opinions about what they have read and give their reading partners feedback

At home: Discuss your opinions about something you have read and share why you feel a certain way about the storyline, characters or aspects of the book.

Math: Students will learn to solve word problems with three addends as a way for them to begin to explore ways to make ten. They will work on word problems that always include at least two numbers that make 10 when added together. Students will be able to engage in rich dialogue about the mathematical strategies and determine which are most useful.

At home: Review words found in word problems. For example, addition words: add, both, plus, together. Subtraction words: difference, fewer, less than. Find simple ways to review how to make ten with simple household items or through playing games. Example: how many pairs of socks will give you ten, $2+2+2+2=10$.

LO QUE ESTAMOS APRENDIENDO ESTE MES

Escritura: los estudiantes escriben piezas de no ficción (How to Books) y continúan aprendiendo sobre las etapas de la escritura. Por ejemplo, redacción, edición y publicación. Todos los estudiantes publicarán un escrito al final de la unidad de estudio. ¡Discuta y apoye diariamente el viaje de escritura de su hijo a través de las siguientes recomendaciones y no se olvide de preguntarles sobre su celebración de publicación!

En casa: elija un tema de no ficción favorito. Hable sobre todos los aspectos del tema. Dibújalo en un diagrama. Rotula todas sus partes. (Ej. Perros - razas, nutrición, hábitat, etc.)

Lectura: los lectores de Woodside están aprendiendo a leer libros más difíciles. Los estudiantes se están convirtiendo en expertos en no ficción y están aprendiendo cómo usar las características de no ficción para ganar significado, encontrar patrones y descifrar palabras más difíciles mediante el uso de características de no ficción.

En casa: lea con sus hijos todas las noches y discuta con ellos las ilustraciones y las características de la impresión de no ficción. Pídale que señalen lo que notan sobre cada una de las características y que discutan de qué se trata la información.

Matemáticas: unidades de medida: los estudiantes continúan su exploración de la medida durante la próxima semana y luego comenzarán a trabajar en oraciones numéricas y datos rápidos que hacen 5, incluidos los enlaces numéricos.

En casa: apoya este aprendizaje explorando qué tan altas son las cosas. Utiliza objetos simples para medir cosas alrededor de la casa. Además, ayude a su hijo a contar objetos simples y hacer combinaciones de 5. Por ejemplo, 2 cucharas + 3 tenedores = 5

Primer Grado

Lo Que Estamos Aprendiendo Este Mes

Escritura: Los escritores de primer grado comenzarán a comprender que categorizamos, explicamos, convencemos y persuadimos a las personas a través de nuestros escritos. Los estudiantes aprenderán que la escritura puede darles una forma de tomar y defender decisiones importantes. Los estudiantes aprenderán a escribir juicios y a organizar sus razones y a suministrar detalles de apoyo por esas razones. Todos los estudiantes publicarán un escrito al final de la unidad de estudio. Discuta y apoye el viaje de escritura de su hijo diariamente a través de las siguientes recomendaciones y ¡no olvide preguntarles sobre la celebración de su publicación!

En casa: discutir opiniones sobre cosas cotidianas. Por ejemplo, me encanta la pizza de pepperoni y es la mejor porque? O creo que caminar a la escuela es mejor que tomar el autobús escolar porque? Anime a su hijo a dar razones y racionalizar sus pensamientos con detalles. ¡Diviértase con esto!

Lectura: Los estudiantes están aprendiendo a apropiarse de su lectura aprendiendo a controlarse a sí mismos y a utilizar regularmente todas sus estrategias y herramientas para leer textos de nivel más difícil. Los lectores también están siendo presionados para dar opiniones críticas sobre lo que han leído y dar retroalimentación a sus compañeros de lectura.

En casa: Discuta sus opiniones sobre algo que ha leído y comparta por qué siente de cierta manera la historia, los personajes o los aspectos del libro.

Matemáticas: los estudiantes aprenderán a resolver problemas verbales para que comiencen a explorar formas de hacer diez. Trabajaran en problemas de palabras que siempre incluyen al menos dos números que forman 10 cuando se suman. Los estudiantes podrán participar en un rico diálogo sobre las estrategias matemáticas y determinar cuáles son las más útiles.

En casa: repasar palabras encontradas en problemas verbales. Por ejemplo, palabras de adición: agregar, ambos, más, juntos. Palabras de resta: diferencia, menos, menos que. Encuentre formas sencillas de repasar cómo hacer diez con artículos simples del hogar o jugando juegos. Ejemplo: ¿Cuántos pares de calcetines te darán diez, $2 + 2 + 2 + 2 + 2 = 10$.




