WHEREAS, said District-wide Energy Performance Project is subject to classification under the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA); and

WHEREAS, "maintenance or repair involving no substantial changes in an existing structure or facility", "replacement, rehabilitation or reconstruction of a structure or facility, in kind, on the same site, including upgrading buildings to meet building, energy or fire codes, unless such action meets or exceeds any of the thresholds in section 6 N.Y.C.R.R. 617.4...", "routine activities of educational institutions, including expansion of existing facilities by less than 10,000 square feet of gross floor area..." and "installation of solar energy arrays on an existing structure..." are classified as

Type II Actions under the current Department of Environmental Conservation SEQRA Regulations (Sections 6 NYCRR 617.5 (c)(1), (2), (10) and (15)); and WHEREAS, the SEQRA Regulations declare Type II Actions to be actions that have no significant impact on the environment and require no further review under SEQRA; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education, as the only involved agency, has examined all information related to the Energy Performance Project and has determined that, based upon recommendation from the School District's Architect of Record, Mosaic Associates, in connection with its review and examination of the Energy Performance Project, that such Energy Performance Project is classified as a Type II Action pursuant to Sections 617.5(c)(1), (2), (10) and (15) of the SEQRA Regulations; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Education of the Peekskill City School District hereby declares itself lead agency in connection with the requirements of the State Environmental Quality Review Act; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Education of the Peekskill City School District, after a review of the proposed action and the opinion provided by the District's Architect of Record, Mosaic Associates, hereby declares that the Districtwide Energy Performance Project is a Type II Action, which requires no further review under SEQRA; and

WHEREAS, the SEQR Regulations declare Type II Actions to be actions that have no significant impact on the environment and require no further review under the SEQRA; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education, as the only involved agency, has examined all information related to the "Proposed 2023 Bond Referendum Projects" and has determined that the "Proposed 2023 Bond Referendum Projects" listed in Attachment A are classified as Type II Actions pursuant to Sections 617.5(c)(1), (2), and (10) of the SEQRA Regulations;

C. RESOLUTION OF THE CITY SCHOOL DISTRICT OF THE CITY OF PEEKSKILL, NEW YORK, ADOPTED OCTOBER 17, 2023, SPECIFYING IN DETAIL THE NECESSITY FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF IMPROVEMENTS AND ALTERATIONS TO DISTRICT BUILDINGS AND/OR THE SITES THEREOF.

RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE CITY SCHOOL DISTRICT OF THE CITY OF PEEKSKILL, IN THE COUNTY OF WESTCHESTER, NEW YORK, AS FOLLOWS: Section 1. The Board of Education of the City School District of the City of Peekskill, in the County of Westchester, New York (the "District") hereby determines that in order to continue to provide appropriate facilities and services to meet the enrollment and program requirements of the District, it is necessary and in the public interest to (a) construct improvements and alterations to District buildings and/or the sites thereof, (the "Project"), substantially as described as in the plan prepared by the District with the assistance of Mosaic Associates Architects, which report is on file and available for public inspection at the office of the District Clerk; including the replacement of roofs; interior reconstruction and space reconfiguration; casework, ceiling, window and flooring replacements; security vestibule addition and grand entrance canopy; asbestos and hazardous material abatement and removal; parking lot, pavement, air conditioning, curbing, exterior building envelope, stairway, retaining wall and restroom improvements; and bleacher replacement and pool infilling, at the estimated cost of \$32,990,000, and (b) construct energy conservation and improvement measures, at the estimated cost of \$12,000,000; all of the foregoing to include the original furnishings, equipment, machinery and apparatus, and all ancillary and related site, demolition and other work required in connection therewith, at the estimated total cost of \$44,990,000. Section 2. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

D. BOND RESOLUTION OF THE CITY SCHOOL DISTRICT OF THE CITY OF PEEKSKILL, NEW YORK, ADOPTED OCTOBER 17, 2023, AUTHORIZING THE CONSTRUCTION OF IMPROVEMENTS AND ALTERATIONS TO DISTRICT BUILDINGS AND/OR THE SITES THEREOF; STATING THE ESTIMATED TOTAL COST THEREOF IS \$32,990,000; APPROPRIATING SAID AMOUNT THEREFOR; AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$32,990,000 SERIAL BONDS OF SAID DISTRICT TO FINANCE SAID APPROPRIATION. Recitals

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the City School District of the City of Peekskill, in the County of Westchester, New York (the "District"), has adopted the required

resolution of necessity pursuant to Section 2512(3) of the Education Law for the construction of improvements and alterations to District buildings and/or the sites thereof; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the District and its inhabitants that the Board of Education authorize the necessary financing for said Project,

Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE CITY SCHOOL DISTRICT OF THE CITY OF PEEKSKILL, IN THE COUNTY OF WESTCHESTER, NEW YORK, (by the favorable vote of not less than three-fifths of all the members of said Board of Education) AS FOLLOWS: Section 1. The City School District of the City of Peekskill, in the County of Westchester, New York (herein called "District"), is hereby authorized to construct improvements and alterations to District buildings and/or the sites thereof (the "Project"), substantially as described as in the plan prepared by the District with the assistance of Mosaic Associates Architects, which report is on file and available for public inspection at the office of the District Clerk; including the replacement of roofs; interior reconstruction and space reconfiguration; casework, ceiling, window and flooring replacements; security vestibule addition and grand entrance canopy; asbestos and hazardous material abatement and removal; parking lot, pavement, air conditioning, curbing, exterior building envelope, stairway, retaining wall and restroom improvements; and bleacher replacement and pool infilling; all of the foregoing to include the original furnishings, equipment, machinery and apparatus, and all ancillary and related site, demolition and other work required in connection therewith. The estimated total cost of the foregoing, including the preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and to the financing thereof, is \$32,990,000, and said amount is hereby appropriated therefor. The plan of financing includes the issuance of \$32,990,000 serial bonds of the District to finance said appropriation, and the levy and collection of taxes on all the taxable real property in the District to pay the principal of said bonds and the interest thereon as the same shall become due and

Section 2. Serial bonds of the District in the principal amount of \$32,990,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (herein called "Law"), to finance said appropriation.

Section 3. (a) The period of probable usefulness applicable to the purposes for which said serial bonds authorized pursuant to Section 2 of this resolution are to be issued, within the limitations of Section 11.00 a. 97 of the Law, is thirty (30) years. (b) The proceeds of the bonds herein authorized and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds may be applied to reimburse the District for expenditures made after the effective date of this resolution for the purpose or purposes for which said bonds are authorized. The foregoing statement of intent with respect to reimbursement is made in conformity with Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2 of the United States Treasury Department.

Section 4. Each of the bonds authorized by this resolution, and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, shall contain the recital of validity as prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Law and said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds shall be general obligations of the District,

payable as to both principal and interest by general tax upon all the taxable real property within the District without limitation of rate or amount. The faith and credit of the District are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds, and any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, and provision shall be made annually in the budget of the District by appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the bonds and any notes in anticipation thereof to mature in such year and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in such year.

Section 5. Subject to the provisions of this resolution and of the Law and pursuant to the provisions of Section 21.00 relative to the issuance of bonds having substantially level or declining annual debt service, Section 30.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bond anticipation notes and of Section 50.00 and Sections 56.00 to 60.00 of the Law, the powers and duties of the Board of Education relative to authorizing bond anticipation notes and prescribing the terms, form and contents and as to the sale and issuance of the bonds herein authorized, and of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, and the renewals of said bond anticipation notes, are hereby delegated to the President of the Board of Education, the chief fiscal officer of the District.

Section 6. The validity of the bonds authorized by this resolution, and of any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, may be contested only if:

- (a) such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the District is not authorized to expend money, or
- (b) the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of such resolution, or a summary thereof, are not substantially complied with,

and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or

(c) such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the constitution. Section 7. A proposition for the approval or disapproval of this bond resolution shall be submitted to the qualified voters of the District at a Special District Meeting to be held on December 12, 2023, and such proposition shall require the approval of a majority of the qualified voters present and voting thereon at said Special District Meeting.

RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE CITY SCHOOL DISTRICT OF THE CITY OF PEEKSKILL, IN THE COUNTY OF WESTCHESTER, NEW YORK, AS FOLLOWS: Section 1. A Special District Meeting of the qualified voters of the City School District of the City of Peekskill, in the County of Westchester, New York (the "District"), shall be held within the District, on Tuesday, December 12, 2023, at 7:00 o'clock A.M.
