



Fantastic Frogs

Frogs are interesting animals. Frogs are in the 8 14 group of animals called amphibians. Other amphibians are toads and salamanders. Frogs 20 are cold blooded. This means that their bodies 28 37 are the same temperature as the water or air 47 around them. They lay in the sun to get warm, 57 or go into the water to cool off. Mother frogs 6^L lay eggs. When they hatch, they become 71 tadpoles. The tadpoles look like little fish. 80 They grow and begin to look like adult frogs. 80 As eggs and tadpoles, they live in the water. 97 When they become adults, they live on land.

Pancake Recipe

Dry and wet ingredients are mixed together to make pancake batter.

The liquid batter becomes a breadlike pancake after it is cooked. Some people enjoy eating pancakes with maple syrup or fruit.

How to make 12 small pancakes You will need:

I In a small bowl, beat the egg with a whisk and add the milk. Place the flour, sugar and salt in a large

bowl.

- - 3 Heat a teaspoon of butter or oil in the frying pan. Add 1 large spoonful of batter to the pan.



2 Slowly pour the milk mixture into the flour. Keep stirring all the time until you have a smooth



4 Cook over medium heat until the bubbles pop. Flip the pancake over and cook on the other side until golden brown.




