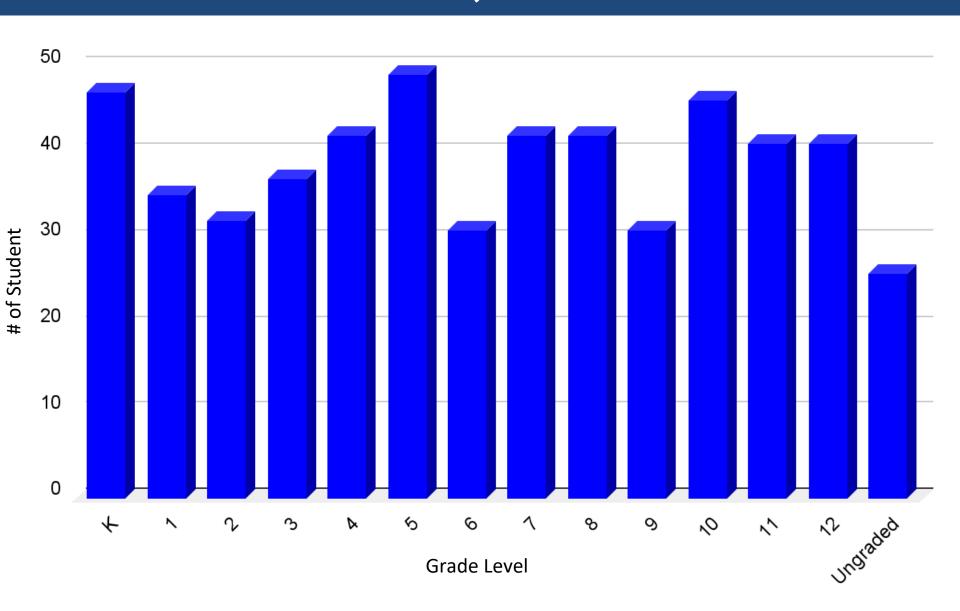

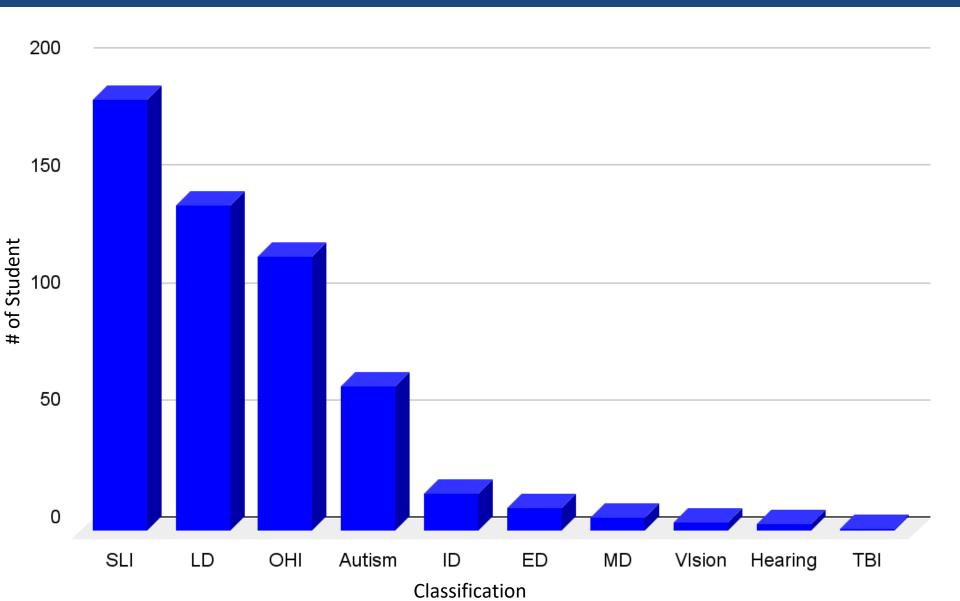

Special Education Students In District by Grade Level



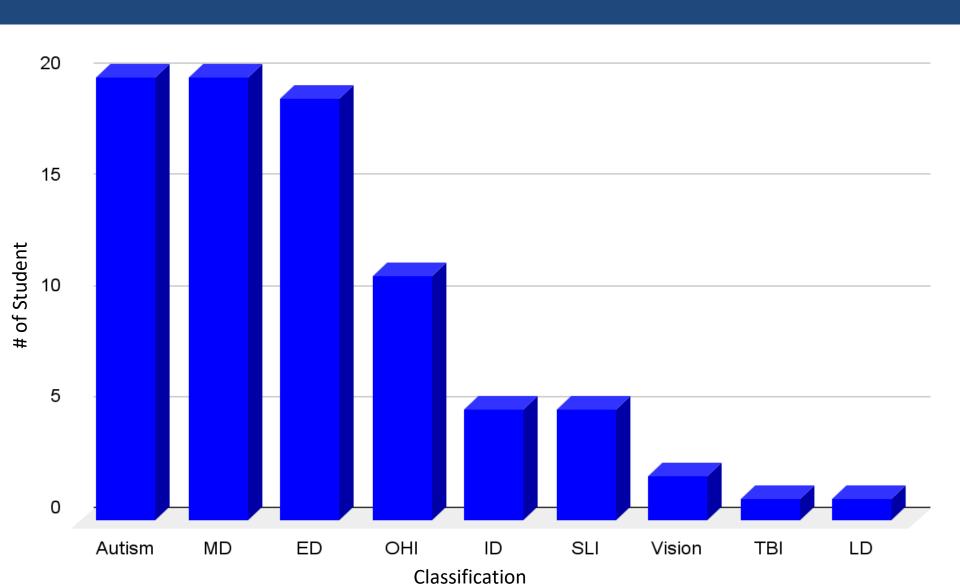
Special Education Students In District by Classification

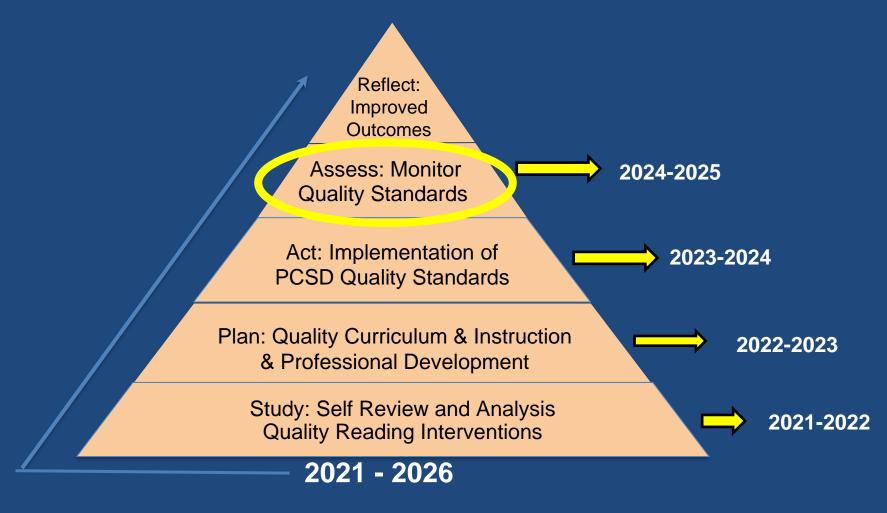
Special Education 5 Year Plan 2016-2021

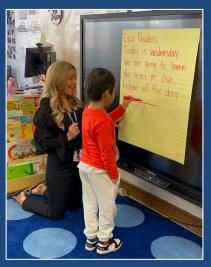

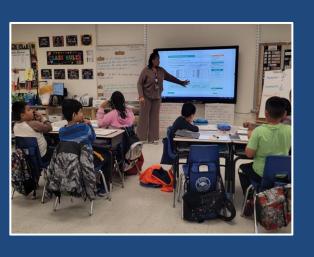
