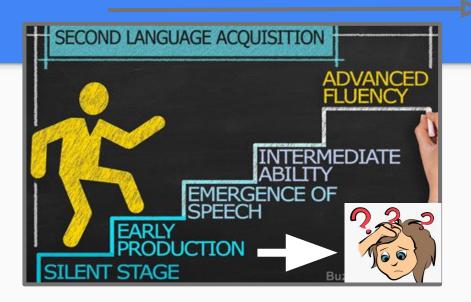
The Bilingual Brain/El Cerebro Bilingüe Spanish + English = Whole Child

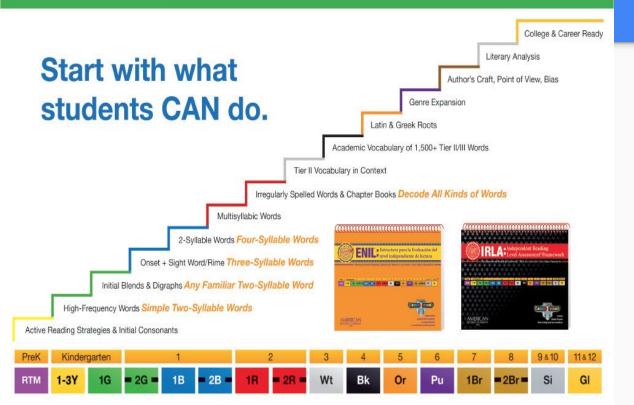

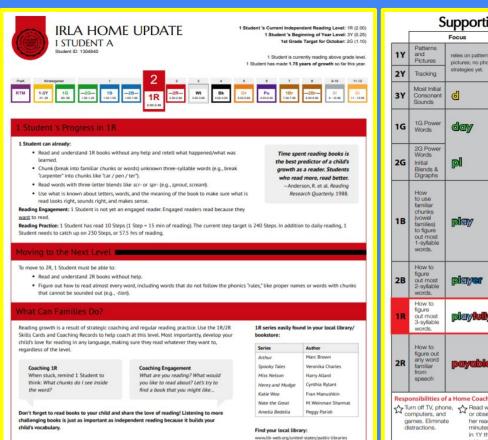

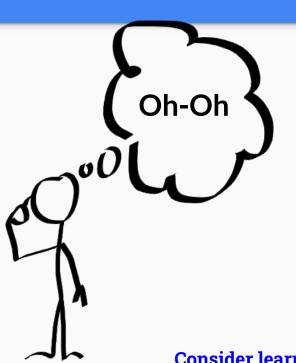

Recommendations for reinforcing Spanish at home:

- **Decorate their rooms with Spanish posters**
- Schedule regular time on Spanish digital resources and platforms
- **Purchase bilingual books**
- Pair your child up with a bilingual buddy (pen pals/virtual pen pals)
- **Listen to music in Spanish**
- -Do you know anyone who lives in a Spanish speaking country? Schedule Skype or Zoom calls.
- -Listen /watch Spanish cartoons and programs that expose your child to vocabulary (nature programs, discovery channel in Spanish, animal planet in Spanish)
- Try out some free language learning apps
- Implement daily routines they can follow in **Spanish** (create a chart with visuals)
- -Exposure, Exposure, Exposure!

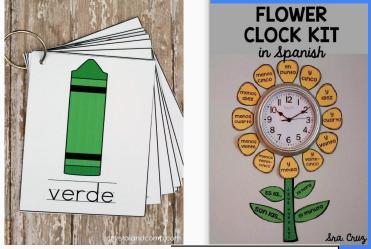
